

# Greensboro, North Carolina



**GREENSBORO** is the largest city in Guilford County. It has been the home of North Carolina A&T since 1893 when the school was relocated from Raleigh, where it was originally founded in 1891.

Greensboro is midway between Raleigh and Winston-Salem, creating an urban triangle known as the Piedmont area. Greensboro has a population of 231,740, making it the third largest city in North Carolina.

## **THE WEATHER**

The average high temperature in Greensboro is 69 degrees. The average low is 48 degrees. The average temperature for the area is 58 degrees.

## **DIVERSITY**

Nearly 40 percent of Greensboro's population is African American. Almost 50 percent of the population is made up of minorities.

## **COLLEGE TOWN**

Students at North Carolina A&T State University have numerous opportunities to socialize with students from other institutions of higher learning in the Greensboro area. The proximity of the schools also make for good athletic rivalries.

There are five colleges or universities within the city of Greensboro (with athletic departments) and seven within Guilford County. In addition to North Carolina A&T State University, Greensboro is home to the University of North Carolina-Greensboro, Greensboro College, Guilford College and Bennett College. High Point University is located in Guilford County and Winston-Salem State University and Elon University are also near.

## **THE GREENSBORO COLISEUM**

The Greensboro Coliseum is a 23, 500-seat arena that host various events in the city, including NC A&T's homecoming concert and NC A&T football and basketball coaches luncheons.
