North Carolina A&T is off to its 32nd 2-0 start in school history. The Aggies have started the last two seasons 2-0. The Aggies have finished under .500 just three times in school history after a 2-0 start, including last season's 3-9 finish. On 13 separate occasions, the Aggies have lost their third game of the season after starting 2-0. In fact, seven out of their last eight 2-0 starts were accompanied by a loss in the third game of the season.

The Hampton Scouting Report

Over the past decade, the Hampton Pirates have built one of the best programs not only in black college football, but throughout the nation. The Pirates have used that success to cause problems for the Aggies, having won the last five matchups while scoring an average of 46.6 points in the process. They have compiled 523 yards of offense this season, but they are surrendering 364.5 yards per game in their first two outings. Offensively, the Pirates are led by running LaMarcus Coker, who is averaging 7.0 yards per carry. He has 181 yards rushing and two touchdowns on the season. Quarterback Herbert Bynes threw for 2,723 yards and 19 touchdowns last season, but he lost his job to David LeGree this season. LeGree has completed 47.6 percent of his passes over the first two games and has thrown for 330 yards and two touchdowns.

Inside the Numbers...

- 1** – In 12 seasons as a defensive coordinator at three different MEAC schools, Alonzo Lee’s defenses have finished No. 1 in the conference five times.
- 3** -- The number of wins the Aggies have in the bank thus far. The Aggies won three games over the previous three seasons.
- 5** – The Aggies received five preseason honors. Senior Jarrell Herring earned preseason All-American honors from Consensus Draft Services. CDS also named senior linebacker Andre Thornton and junior offensive lineman Enoch Cohen preseason All-HBCU. Thornton and senior defensive end Tyre Glasper earned preseason second-team all-MEAC honors.
- 5** – Is the number of three-year starters the Aggies have on their 2009 defense.
- 6** – It has been six seasons since the Aggies have had the No. 1 defense in the conference. The defensive coordinator of that team was Alonzo Lee.
- 7** – Seven of Lee’s 12 last defenses finished among in the top 40 defenses in the nation.
- 16** -- Is the number of sacks the Aggies posted last season. They have six so far this season.
- 20**- Is the number of yards Dontavious Payne had on his first career as an Aggie.
- 27** – Is the number of tackles senior Andre Thornton needs to move into the Aggies top-10 list all-time. Thornton comes into the season with 234 career tackles.
- 36** – The number of straight games safety Nick Clement has played in as an Aggie.

Pirate/Aggie connections

The biggest connection between N.C. A&T and Hampton is N.C. A&T head coach Alonzo Lee. Lee served as the Pirates defensive coordinator six seasons (1997-2002), and used his defense schemes to help the Pirates when two MEAC titles during his tenure. Hampton head coach Don Rose worked closely with Lee as the Pirates secondary coach. The Pirates have three players from North Carolina on their roster, including Greensboro native Brandon Pequese. Pequese, Grimsley High graduate, had six tackles against the Aggies last season. Hampton junior running back Gerald Griffin and Aggies sophomore cornerback Quay Long both attended West Charlotte High.

A Glance at the Aggies 2009 Opponents

Including Delaware State, who will forfeit a game to the Aggies this season, N.C. A&T’s 11 2009 opponents were 63-64 last season. The good news for the Aggies is their first seven opponents were 30-49 last season. The bad news is, the final three opponents the Aggies will face were 27-9 in 2008, including defending MEAC Champion S.C. State. There is no difference in the Aggies schedule other than not playing Johnson C. Smith this season. Four of the Aggies opponents – Hampton, Bethune-Cookman, Florida A&M and S.C. State – had winning records last season. Two of the Aggies opponents – Coastal Carolina and Morgan State – had .500 records. Meanwhile, five of the opponents had losing records.

Saturday's Captains vs. NSU

The four men who walked out as captains for the Aggies on Saturday were wide receiver Giorgio Lowrance, senior quarterback Carlton Fears, senior defensive end Tyre Glasper and senior defensive lineman Adam Beal. All four players are seniors with two of the players – Beal and Glasper – being fifth-year seniors. Fears, a junior college transfer, was the only player who has been at N.C. A&T less than two years. Despite the Aggies having 51 players from North Carolina, Lowrance was the only captain on Saturday from North Carolina. Fears is from Georgia and Beal and Glasper are from Detroit.

Recapng the NSU Game

SUPER ROOKIE

Sophomore Mike Mayhew has scored a touchdown in each of his first two games as an Aggie. He is the first Aggies rookie to score a touchdown in each of his first two games since Charlie Sutton did it in 1978. Another touchdown against Hampton and Mayhew could become the first Aggie rookie running back to score at least one touchdown in his first three career games. Mayhew is a unique rookie in that he is a sophomore because of being a Prop player last season. Therefore, he is not eligible for any Aggie freshman records. Barry Turner owns the rookie rushing record for N.C. A&T with 556 yards in 1990. Al Holland owns the rookie record for touchdowns with 12.

SOME HIGHS AND LOWS FROM NORFOLK STATE

The Aggies defense held the Spartans without a point for the final 44 minutes of the game. Norfolk State's 13 points on Saturday was the fewest amount of points the Spartans have scored in the series since 2002. It was also the lowest amount of points scored by the Spartans during the five-year Pete Adrian series. Over the final six games of last season, the Aggies did not record more than 200 yards of offense. Over the Aggies first two games this season, the Aggies have compiled more than 200 yards of offense. In three of the final five games last season, the Aggies failed to compile more than 100 yards rushing. But the Aggies have rushed for 159 and 147 yards respectively over the first two games.

MEAC ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Mayhew aided North Carolina A&T to a 17-13 win over Norfolk State and scored the Aggies game-winning touchdown for the second straight week. Mayhew rushed 14 times for 87 yards and one touchdown. He also caught one pass for 13 yards. Mayhew carried the ball on every play of a 61-yard drive to start the second half that ended with an 8-yard scoring run.

CAN HE BE BLOCKED?

Tyre Glasper leads the Aggies in sacks and he continues to climb up the Aggies all-time sacks list. On the season, Glasper has eight quarterback hurries and three sacks. Glasper career-high in sacks in 5.5, so he is well on his way to eclipsing that mark. The Aggies all-time sack leader is Chris McNeil who amassed an amazing 30 sacks over two seasons. Glasper currently has 12 career sacks.

Senior quarterback Carlton Fears has already thrown the football 48 times this season. At this pace, Fears will throw the football close to 250 times this season. The last Aggies quarterback with more than 200 pass attempts in a season was Wayne Campbell in 2006. The last Aggies quarterback with more than 250 attempts was Maseo Bolin in 1995. In fact, only two quarterbacks – Bolin and Campbell – have thrown the football more than 200 times in the last 15 seasons. Alan Hooker owns the record for pass attempts in a season with 311. Only Ellsworth Turner, Alan Hooker and Maseo Bolin have thrown the football more than 250 times in a season for the Aggies.

A YEAR AGO AGAINST THE PIRATES

The great news for North Carolina A&T is that the man who terrorized the Aggies last season with two punt returns for touchdowns, is no longer playing for Hampton. Jeremy Gilchrist returned punts for 56 and 88 yards last season, which essentially sealed the fate of the Aggies late in the first half as the Pirates went on to win 44-7. Unfortunately for the Aggies, the Pirates still have a very good punt and kickoff returner. It was the Pirates fifth straight win over N.C. A&T. On offense, the Pirates return Tennessee transfer LaMarcus Coker. Coker averaged 7.2 yards per carry in last season's game and scored a touchdown. Defensively, the Pirates were led by Michael Swett. Swett finished the game with 12 tackles, 2 ½ tackles for loss 1 ½ sacks and an interception. Sam Pope added nine tackles and two pass deflections. Both men are playing on the Pirates defense this season. Last season's game marked the first career start for quarterback Carlton Fears. Fears was 13-for-21 for 76 yards, an interception and a touchdown. Wallace Miles led the Aggies with six pass receptions. In his first career start, middle linebacker Brandon Jackson recorded eight tackles to go along with cornerback Quay Long's eight tackles.

VALMONT NAMED OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Jason Valmont made several key blocks to open the second half and help the Aggies to a 17-13 victory over Norfolk State. Valmont graded out at 92-percent of his assignments and assisted the Aggies that accounted for 231 yards of total offense. He also recorded four pancake blocks. Valmont is a sophomore out of Lake Charles, La.

ONLY GIORGIO

Giorgio Lowrance returns to N.C. A&T for his senior season. Lowrance is currently the only Aggie on the roster who can brag about a 100-yard receiving game.

A LONG RETURN

Quay Long intercepted a Dennis Brown pass on Saturday and returned it 40 yards down to the NSU 20-yard line. Long's interception return was the longest since Brandon Colbert returned an interception 45 yards against Howard on Oct. 21, 2006.

NO POINTS BEYOND THE FIRST

Last week, the Aggies didn't allow Norfolk State to score over the final 44 minutes of the game. A week earlier, the Aggies prevented the Rams from scoring over the final 34 minutes of the game in a 19-10 win. All of this means that the Aggies have yet to allow a second-half point this season. A goal line stand against Norfolk State and 4th-down stop late in the game solidified the second-half freeze out.

THE MANY FACES OF THE AGGIE QUARTERBACK

North Carolina A&T has had many different quarterbacks over the past seven seasons. The Aggies have had eight quarterbacks see action in the past six seasons. That is a little more than a different quarterback each season. The one thing that has been consistent for the Aggies at the quarterback position is the starter on opening day. For the past three seasons, Herb Miller has started the opener for N.C. A&T.

TELEVISION WOES

The Aggies have not looked good since ESPNU started televising MEAC games. In fact, the Aggies have not won on television since ESPNU began televising N.C. A&T games back in 2005. Their last win on television came on Oct. 23, 2004 on C-SET, a channel that no longer exists. The Aggies are giving up an average of 48.2 points per game on ESPNU and have lost by an average margin of 33.6 points.

FAMILIAR TERRITORY

Alonzo Lee is the fifth head coach the Aggies have had in the last eight years. But this time around Lee had some familiarity to his staff. Defensive back coach Travis Oliver has been with the Aggies through four of the five administrations. Oliver enters his sixth season at N.C. A&T, so the Aggies secondary has pretty much had stability over the past few seasons. Offensive coordinator/offensive line-men coach Chennis Berry spent three seasons at N.C. A&T (2003-2005). Berry is familiar with some of the recent Aggie graduates, so there was not a bid adjustment for him returning. Defensive line/special teams coordinator Tyrone Odums was the Aggies defensive coordinator last season. Running backs coach George Ragsdale has been on the staff the last four seasons. He even had a stint as the Aggies interim head coach in 2008. And of course, there is Lee, who was the Aggies defensive coordinator from 2003-05. He recruited defensive line-men Tyre Glasper and Adam Beal.

THE MAD TACKLER

Andre Thornton is slowly moving up the all-time tackles list for N.C. A&T. He has 227 career tackles, 18.5 tackles for loss and 10 pass deflections for his career. On Saturday, Thornton recorded six tackles and a sack. Thornton has averaged 73.7 tackles per season since being an Aggie. At that pace, he will come close to finishing with 300 career tackles, which would put him in the top 7 all-time. He needs just 34 tackles to move into the top 10 all-time on the list.

There is a lot of upside for head coach Alonzo Lee starting 2-0 in his first season as the Aggies head coach. He is only the fourth head coach in school history to start 2-0, joining Hornsby Howell (1968) and his former boss George Small (2003). Lee could also join the duo in terms of a successful first season. Howell's Aggies won the Black College National Championship, and Small's Aggies won the MEAC Championship.

LEE WINS HIS DEBUT

Head coach Alonzo Lee became just the fifth Aggies head coach to win his debut in school history. The last coach to win his opener is Lee's assistant head coach George Ragsdale. Ragsdale led the Aggies to a win over Howard as the Aggies interim head coach in 2008 when he took over for Fobbs toward the end of the season. The other coaches to win their debut is Lee's former boss at A&T George Small, Hornsby Howell and Horace Bell.

WHEN DID THEY KNOW

THE ROSTER BREAKDOWN

The Aggies are hoping for success this season, but they definitely built for the future. The Aggies roster consists of 31 true freshmen and six redshirt freshmen. There are also 21 sophomores on the roster to go along with 16 juniors and 14 seniors. The N.C. A&T football team is represented by 14 states and Washington, D.C. By far North Carolina is represented the most with 51 players from the Old North State. The state of Florida is represented well with eight players on the roster. The Aggies roster also has six players from Georgia and three players apiece are from California, Michigan and Maryland. The other states represented include Louisiana, New York, South Carolina, Kentucky, Alabama, New Jersey and Tennessee.

ALL THE STREAKS ARE OVER

The Aggies ended their school-record 27-game losing streak against Johnson C. Smith last season on Aug. 30 with a 44-12 win. They broke their 25-game losing streak in the MEAC on Oct. 25, 2008 when they defeated Howard 21-20 at Aggie Stadium. And on Saturday, the final woeful streak that stemmed from the 2005 season is now over. Heading into their road game against Winston-Salem State on Saturday, the Aggies had not won on an opponent's home field in 22 games. That is over thanks to the Aggies 19-10 win at Bowman Gray Stadium. Their last win on a team's home field came on Nov. 1, 2003 when the Aggies defeated Bethune-Cookman 13-7 in Daytona Beach, Fla. In fact, in the Aggies last 40 games away from Aggie Stadium, they were just 8-32 dating back to 2002. The Aggies last win away from Aggie Stadium was Oct. 8, 2005 when they defeated Morgan State 40-33 in overtime at FedEx Field.

AN AGGIES WIN MEANS

... The Aggies will be off to their best start in eight seasons. The Aggies started the 2001 season 3-0 before losing to Morgan State 52-42.

... The Aggies will end their five-game losing streak to Hampton. The last time N.C. A&T defeated Hampton was in 2003 when the Aggies went on to win the MEAC Championship.

... North Carolina A&T head coach Alonzo Lee will match the best start ever by a first-year Aggies head coach. In 1968, Hornsby Howell started 3-0, and went on to win the Black College National Championship.

... The Aggies will essentially have three conference wins before the month of September is over thanks to an eventual forfeit they will receive at the hands of Delaware State. The Aggies will pick up that win on Oct. 17.

- In 12 seasons as a defensive coordinator at Morgan State, Hampton and North Carolina A&T, Lee has had the No. 1 defense in the MEAC five times.

- He also coached at Florida State and Arizona. Lee also played under John Teerlinck (current Indianapolis Colts defensive line coach) at Eastern Illinois. He also coached under legendary college football coaches Willie Jeffries, Billy Joe and Joe Taylor.
- During his 12 seasons as a defensive coordinator, Lee coached 13 All-Americans. Those players were either AFCA, Associated Press or SBN Black College All-Americans.
