SERIES NOTES: North Carolina A&T ended its two-game losing streak to the Rams last season with a 14-8 win at Aggie Stadium...After playing 23 straight seasons, the series between the Aggies and the Rams took a six-year break before being renewed in 2006...The Aggies have won 4 out of the last five games played at Bowman Gray Stadium against the Rams...The Aggies have scored just 35 points since the series was renewed in '06...WSSU coach Kermit Blount is 2-9 lifetime against the Aggies.

Season Openers

North Carolina A&T football holds a 46-32-7 all-time record in season openers. The Aggies won 13 straight season openers from 1989-2001, the best run in program history. In fact, from 1986-2003 the Aggies lost just two season openers. In 1988, they lost 15-2 at N.C. Central and in 2002 the Eagles defeated the Aggies 33-30 in the Aggie-Eagle Classic in Raleigh.

Last season, the Aggies ended a three-game streak of losing on opening day with a 14-8 win over Winston-Salem State. Out of the 46 times the Aggies have won on opening day, they have gone on to have a winning season 30 times.

The Winston-Salem State Scouting Report

Winston-Salem State has had interesting competition at quarterback with incumbent quarterback Jarrett Dunston leading the way. Dunston was 5-for-8 against the Aggies last season for 39 yards passing. The Aggies also sacked Dunston four times a year ago. But the most important return to the Rams offensive lineup may be running back Brandon McRae. After having his season end early that last two years with injuries, the dangerous runner looks to add some punch to the Rams offense. McRae had 85 yards rushing and a touchdown on 15 carries against the Aggies in 2007. On the defensive side of the ball, sophomore defensive ends Akeem Ward and Joshua Newkirk are the cornerstone of the Rams defense. Senior linebackers Juan Corders, Chedrick Marshall and Mario Dawson lead the way.

Inside the Numbers...

- 1** – In 12 seasons as a defensive coordinator at three different MEAC schools, Alonzo Lee’s defenses have finished No. 1 in the conference five times.
- 5** – The Aggies received five preseason honors. Senior Jarrell Herring earned preseason All-American honors from Consensus Draft Services. CDS also named senior linebacker Andre Thornton and junior offensive lineman Enoch Cohen preseason All-HBCU. Thornton and senior defensive end Tyre Glasper earned preseason second-team all-MEAC honors.
- 5** – Is the number of three-year starters the Aggies have on their 2009 defense.
- 5.5** – Nigel Tomlin led the Aggies in average per carry last season at 5.5 per touch.
- 6** – It has been six seasons since the Aggies have had the No. 1 defense in the conference. The defensive coordinator of that team was Alonzo Lee.
- 7** -- Andre Thornton has posted seven double-figure tackle games during his career.
- 7** – Seven of Lee’s 12 last defenses finished among in the top 40 defenses in the nation.
- 15** – Five of those defenses ranked among the top 15 in the nation.
- 32** – Placekicker Eric Houston has scored 32 points in each of the last two seasons
- 34** – The number of straight games safety Nick Clement has played in as an Aggie.
- 40** – Is the number of tackles senior Andre Thornton needs to move into the Aggies top-10 list all-time. Thornton comes into the season with 221 career tackles.

Ram/Aggie connections

There are several N.C. A&T/Winston-Salem State connections which is expected from teams separated by only 25 miles. The Aggies have just one player on its roster from Winston-Salem, while the Rams boast of seven players from Greensboro. Meanwhile, the Aggies have 10 players from Greensboro, therefore there should be some interesting battles. Enoch Cohen, the sole Winston-Salem native on the Aggies roster, played with defensive back Marvin Bohannon at North Forsyth High School.

Head coaching connection

Alonzo Lee has coached at five different MEAC schools, and over that time he has been fortunate to make friendships with many coaches around the MEAC. WSSU head coach Kermit Blount and Lee coached together at Howard.

A Glance at the Aggies 2009 Opponents

Including Delaware State, who will forfeit a game to the Aggies this season, N.C. A&T’s 11 2009 opponents were 63-64 last season. The good news for the Aggies is their first seven opponents were 30-49 last season. The bad news is, the final three opponents the Aggies will face were 27-9 in 2008, including defending MEAC Champion S.C. State. There is no difference in the Aggies schedule other than not playing Johnson C. Smith this season. Four of the Aggies opponents – Hampton, Bethune-Cookman, Florida A&M and S.C. State – had winning records last season. Two of the Aggies opponents – Coastal Carolina and Morgan State – had .500 records. Meanwhile, five of the opponents had losing records.

2009 Leaders

The Aggies are fortunate to have several different leaders this season. But the two that stand out among the Aggies senior class is quarterback Carlton Fears and defensive end Tyre Glasper. Head coach Alonzo Lee feels comfortable with putting his offense in Fears' hands. The senior has been steady in practice and has shown a desire to learn all he can about the Aggies new offense. Glasper is a fifth-year senior who has played well despite some lean years at N.C. A&T.

He is one of the best defensive ends in the MEAC, and his offseason workouts has made him a natural leader for the Aggies.

2009 Seniors

76 OL Nate Anderson

Anderson Skinny: He is a quality character guy on the Aggies roster. Last season, he had to play several different positions along the offensive line because of injuries.

92 DL Adam Beal

Beal Skinny: A quality run stopper for the Aggies, Beal heads into the season with high expectations. His solid play will go a long way in benefiting middle linebacker Brandon Jackson.

88 WR Cedric Byrd

Byrd Skinny: He has been a solid receiver for the Aggies the past four seasons. He provides the Aggies with a valuable set of hands.

21 FS Nick Clement

Clement Skinny: He will finish his career as a four-year starter. He is an excellent tackler and solid leader in the Aggies secondary.

14 QB Carlton Fears

Fears Skinny: It could be a breakout season for the junior college transfer. The offensive coaches have put in an offense they believe fits Fears' skill set. Another plus is, at this time, he doesn't have someone breathing down his neck for the starting job.

24 TE Brett Fisher

Fisher Skinny: After taking a year off, Fisher is back in the Aggies lineup and could play a key role offensively. He has the speed and the hands that could give linebackers trying to cover him fits.

94 DE Tyre Glasper

Glasper Skinny: He has been as steady as any Aggies defensive player. He has 13 career tackles for loss and has recovered four fumbles.

53 LB Jamison Hedgepeth

Hedgepeth Skinny: Hedgepeth's success has gotten lost in the success of Andre Thornton. But Hedgepeth is an excellent pass rusher with an engine that is always on go.

51 DE Jarrell Herring

Herring Skinny: Herring is a junior college transfer who is a part of the Detroit defensive linemen trio for the Aggies. He had an outstanding opening season for the Aggies after transferring in from Grand Rapids Community College.

26 DB Josef Peek

Peek Skinny: He has been a solid reserve player who has benefited the Aggies greatly in nickel coverages and on special teams.

84 WR Josh Smith

Smith Skinny: He is in his first season with the Aggies after transferring in from Elizabeth City State.

46 LB Andre Thornton

Thornton Skinny: He has not had the wins he wants, but he has put together an excellent career that has seen him make 221 tackles in three years.

27 DB Vernon White

White Skinny: He started his career as a wide receiver, but has turned into a valuable safety for the Aggies.

Taking the snaps

North Carolina A&T will start senior Carlton Fears in the Aggies opener against Winston-Salem State. Fears made four starts and played in seven games last season with his best game, but failed to throw for 100 yards in any of those games. He did have 82 yards rushing against N.C. Central. He also had 13 completions against Hampton.

A NICE PROBLEM

The Aggies came into this season with the daunting task of replacing sixth all-time leading rusher Michael Ferguson. As the season approaches, they may have more qualified candidates than they bargained for. At the head of the list is 5-foot-10, 205-pound sophomore Mike Mayhew. Mayhew has impressed throughout preseason camp, and he will get a few touches on Saturday. Junior college transfer Tony Coles is a 6-3, 235-pound nightmare for defenses trying to bring him down. Rounding out the trio of talented backs is Florida native Dontavious Payne. Payne is a 5-9, 205-pound freshman with lightning quick speed. The Aggies dilemma is no longer who but how they will find time to get the ball into the hands of three different runners.

MAKE THAT CHANGE

Burlington native Kreg Carter has spent the previous two seasons on the Aggies defensive line. This season instead of trying to knock lineman down, he will be the one trying to keep defenders off of his running backs and quarterbacks. Carter made the change during the spring season, and will start at the left guard position for the Aggies against Winston-Salem State on Saturday.

THEY'RE ALL BACK

The Aggies offensive line yielded much criticism in 2008. They were young and inexperienced with the three freshmen starting. But this season they return much bigger and more mature. The Aggies return four men who started upfront last season. Alex Harper will start for the second straight season at left tackle. Sophomore Brenton Walker returns as the starting center. Sophomore Thomas Hearn will start at right guard for N.C. A&T and rounding out the line will be sophomore Jason Valmont. With the addition of Carter, it should be a better look for N.C. A&T.

EXCITING FRESHMEN RECEIVERS

The Aggies are overly excited about two freshman receivers in Larry Raper and Buster Cooper. Raper was ranked as one of the best receivers in the country coming out of Shelby and had 1,400 all-purpose yards. Raper and Cooper possess tremendous speed and could help the Aggies stretch the field this season. Neither player is over 5-foot-10, but they have big-play potential. Cooper caught 72 passes for 650 yards as a senior at North Atlanta High School.

ONLY GIORGIO

Giorgio Lowrance returns to N.C. A&T for his senior season. Lowrance is currently the only Aggie on the roster who can brag about a 100-yard receiving game. He had 115 yards receiving against Norfolk St. last season.

THE FORFEIT

The Aggies will not play Delaware State this season. The Hornets decided to forfeit a game to the Aggies after running into a scheduling conflict with the University of Michigan they could not relinquish because of financial concerns. The Aggies were to play the Hornets on Oct. 17, but instead the Aggies will be given a victory that day. The Aggies will not be able to count the game as a victory until Oct. 17. This essentially means the Aggies will have two bye weeks in 2009.

THE MANY FACES OF THE AGGIE QUARTERBACK

North Carolina A&T has had many different quarterbacks over the past seven seasons. The Aggies have had eight quarterbacks see action in the past six seasons. That is a little more than a different quarterback each season. The one thing that has been consistent for the Aggies at the quarterback position is the starter on opening day. For the past three seasons, Herb Miller has started the opener for N.C. A&T.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

DURABLE CLEMENT

Nick Clement has been a reliable defensive back for position coach Travis Oliver. Clement has not missed a start in his career. Clement has seven pass break ups in his career. He has made 128 tackles and picked off one pass. He ranked third on the team in tackles. Clement has also been a master for the Aggies on special teams. He scored on a 50-yard touchdown pass on a fake punt against N.C. Central last season. He also rushed for 37 yards on a fake punt against Florida A&M.

THE MAD TACKLER

Andre Thornton is slowly moving up the all-time tackles list for N.C. A&T. He comes into this season with 221 tackles, 17.5 tackles for loss and 10 pass deflections for his career. Thornton has averaged 73.7 tackles per season since being an Aggie. At that pace, he will come close to finishing with 300 career tackles, which would put him in the top 7 all-time.

JAMO THE PLAYMAKER

Hedgepeth has quietly made himself into one of the best defensive players on the Aggies squad. Only one other player – Andre Thornton – has more career tackles than Hedgepeth. Hedgepeth has 147 career tackles and has recovered five fumbles for the Aggies defense. He is only a half-tackle behind Thornton for career tackles for loss with 17.

VETERAN LINEBACKERS

The Aggies have one of the most experienced linebacker trios in the conference. The trio of middle linebacker Brandon Jackson and outside linebackers Andre Thornton and Jamison Hedgepeth give the Aggies an experienced trio at linebacker. Jackson emerged during the spring as the replacement for the Aggies leading tackler in 2008, Brandon Long. The trio combined to make 171 tackles last season.

Only one other team in the Football Championship Subdivision punted more times than the Aggies -- Indiana State. The Aggies did execute four fake punts last season to try to get the offense going. This season, the Aggies up to substantially cut down on the number of times they punt the ball this season.

ALL THE STREAKS ARE OVER...ALMOST

The Aggies ended their school-record 27-game losing streak against Johnson C. Smith last season on Aug. 30 with a 44-12 win. They broke their 25-game losing streak in the MEAC on Oct. 25, 2008 when they defeated Howard 21-20 at Aggie Stadium.

There is still a streak out there, however. Heading into their road game against Winston-Salem State on Saturday, the Aggies have not won on an opponent's home field in 22 games. Their last win on a team's home field came on Nov. 1, 2003 when the Aggies defeated Bethune-Cookman 13-7 in Daytona Beach, Fla. In fact, in the Aggies last 40 games away from Aggie Stadium, they are just 8-32 dating back to 2002. The Aggies last win away from Aggie Stadium was Oct. 8, 2005 when they defeated Morgan State 40-33 in overtime at FedEx Field.

AN AGGIES WIN MEANS

...Head coach Lee would become just the fifth Aggies head coach to win his debut in school history. The last coach to win his opener is Lee's assistant head coach George Ragsdale... Ragsdale led the Aggies to a win over Howard as the Aggies interim head coach in 2008 when he took over for Fobbs toward the end of the season... The other coaches to win their debut is Lee's former boss at A&T George Small, Hornsby Howell and Horace Bell.

...Winston-Salem State head coach Kermit Blount would fall to 2-10 against the Aggies all-time. Blount's only two wins over the Aggies came in 2006 and 2007

...Quarterback Carlton Fears would win his first game as a starter for the Aggies. Fears started four games last season, but lost starts to Hampton, N.C. Central, Morgan State and Florida A&M.

- In 12 seasons as a defensive coordinator at Morgan State, Hampton and North Carolina A&T, Lee has had the No. 1 defense in the MEAC five times.
- Lee Gets Defensive
Seven of Lee's last 12 defenses finished among the top 40 defenses in the nation. Five of those defenses ranked among the top 15 in the nation.
- There are nine schools eligible to compete for an MEAC Championship. Lee has coached at five of those schools, including Howard, Florida A&M, Hampton, N.C. A&T and Morgan State.
- As an assistant coach, Alonzo Lee has won seven MEAC titles at five different schools. Three of those championships came with Lee serving as the defensive coordinator. Some of the best coaches in the country have mentored Lee. Lee played for Darrell Mudra (168-77-3 career record) at Eastern Illinois. Mudra built solid programs at Adams State College, North Dakota State, Eastern Illinois, Northern Iowa and Western Illinois.
- He also coached at Florida State and Arizona. Lee also played under John Teerlinck (current Indianapolis Colts defensive line coach) at Eastern Illinois. He also coached under legendary college football coaches Willie Jeffries, Billy Joe and Joe Taylor.
- During his 12 seasons as a defensive coordinator, Lee coached 13 All-Americans. Those players were either AFCA, Associated Press or SBN Black College All-Americans.
