Aggies face first MEAC road test
 North Carolina A&T goes on the road to face a conference foe for the first time this season. With the home game of Delaware State missing on the schedule because of the Hornets forfeit, the Aggies will play four of their last five MEAC games on the road this season. MEAC road games have not been good for the Aggies lately. Their last conference road win away from Aggie Stadium came in 2005 against Morgan State at FedEx Field in Landover, Md. Two-thousand five was also the last time the Aggies won a game outside the state of North Carolina. The last time the Aggies won on the road at a conference foe's home field was November 1, 2003 against Bethune-Cookman. The Aggies have loss by an average of 19.1 points in their last 22 MEAC games away from home.

The MSU Scouting Report

So far this season, Morgan State's defense has not been as dominant as it was a year ago. But when you add in that the Bears played Division I Akron to open the season, the Bears defense might be rounding into shape. The Bears rank No. 1 in the MEAC in pass defense, but they rank last in rushing defense. The Bears lost MEAC Defensive Player of the Year linebacker Jerrell Guyton, but they do return four first-team All-MEAC defensive players in linebackers George Howard and Troy Leftwich, defensive lineman Justin Lawrence and defensive back Darren McKhan. Howard leads the MEAC in tackles with an amazing 15.0 tackles per game. Offensively, the Bears have struggled. They rank last in the MEAC in rushing offense and eighth in passing offense. Devan James, who had 1,337 yards last season, has only 87 yards rushing this season.

Inside the Numbers...

- 1** – In 12 seasons as a defensive coordinator at three different MEAC schools, Alonzo Lee's defenses have finished No. 1 in the conference five times.
- 2** -- The number of wins the Aggies need to secure their first winning season in six years.
- 4** -- The number of wins the Aggies have in the bank thus far. The Aggies won three games over the previous three seasons.
- 5** – The Aggies received five preseason honors. Senior Jarrell Herring earned preseason All-American honors from Consensus Draft Services. CDS also named senior linebacker Andre Thornton and junior offensive lineman Enoch Cohen preseason All-HBCU. Thornton and senior defensive end Tyre Glasper earned preseason second-team all-MEAC honors.
- 5** – Is the number of three-year starters the Aggies have on their 2009 defense.
- 6** – It has been six seasons since the Aggies have had the No. 1 defense in the conference. The defensive coordinator of that team was Alonzo Lee.
- 6** -- The number of 50-yard punts, freshman Alex Grubb has booted this season for the Aggies.
- 7** – Seven of Lee's 12 last defenses finished among in the top 40 defenses in the nation.
- 11** -- Is the number takeaways the Aggies have this season. Only one team -- S.C. State -- has caused more turnovers than the Aggies.
- 16** -- Is the number of sacks the Aggies posted last season. They have nine so far this season.
- 16** – Is the number of tackles senior Andre Thornton needs to move into the Aggies top-10 list all-time. Thornton comes into the season with 234 career tackles.
- 20** -- The number of interceptions the Aggies have had the last three seasons. The Aggies have six in the first five games this season.
- 41** – The number of straight games safety Nick Clement has played in as an Aggie.

Bear/Aggie connections

The connections between Morgan State and North Carolina A&T this season are obvious. N.C. A&T head coach Alonzo Lee served as Morgan State's defensive coordinator the previous three seasons. Lee coached the Bears to the nation's No. 1 defense last season. Aggies offensive coordinator Chennis Berry also spent the previous three seasons with the Bears where he was the offensive coordinator. The Aggies have one Baltimore native on their roster in starting left tackle Alex Harper. Harper attended Woodlawn High School. The Bears also have a Greensboro native on their roster in Dudley graduate Keith Lee. Lee is a sophomore running back.

A Glance at the Aggies 2009 Opponents

Including Delaware State, who will forfeit a game to the Aggies this season, N.C. A&T's 11 2009 opponents were 63H-64 last season. The good news for the Aggies is their first seven opponents were 30-49 last season. The bad news is, the final three opponents the Aggies will face were 27-9 in 2008, including defending MEAC Champion S.C. State. There is no difference in the Aggies schedule other than not playing Johnson C. Smith this season. Four of the Aggies opponents – Hampton, Bethune-Cookman, Florida A&M and S.C. State – had winning records last season. Two of the Aggies opponents – Coastal Carolina and Morgan State – had .500 records. Meanwhile, five of the opponents had losing records.

Saturday's Captains vs. NCCU

The four men who walked out as captains for the Aggies on Saturday were wide receiver Giorgio Lowrance, senior quarterback Carlton Fears, senior defensive end Tyre Glasper and senior defensive lineman Adam Beal. All four players are seniors with two of the players – Beal and Glasper – being fifth-year seniors. Fears, a junior college transfer, was the only player who has been at N.C. A&T less than two years. Despite the Aggies having 51 players from North Carolina, Lowrance was the only captain on Saturday from North Carolina. Fears is from Georgia and Beal and Glasper are from Detroit.

Recaping the Central Game

... ..Carlton Fears threw for 166 yards and two touchdowns on eight completions...It was the best performance by an Aggies quarterback since freshman Wayne Campbell threw for 219 yards and two touchdowns in a loss to Norfolk State in 2006. It was the best performance by an Aggies quarterback since Rico Watkins threw for 212 yards and two touchdowns on 10-for-18 passing in a 38-28 win over Hampton on November 15, 2003.

...North Carolina A&T blocked its fourth kick of the season. The Aggies have blocked at least one kick in every game this season except for its loss at Coastal Carolina.

...North Carolina A&T's win over N.C. Central on Saturday went to show two things. The Aggies know how to win close games, and the Aggies and the Eagles like to play close games. The Aggies three wins this season have been won by an average of 6.3 points. Every game this season except the loss to Hampton has gone into the fourth with the Aggies leading or trailing by no more than seven points. Meanwhile, the Aggie-Eagle game was decided by six points or less for the fifth time in the last six games between the two schools. It was also the third overtime played in the series in 12 years. It was the Aggies first win over the Eagles in three tries.

The Forfeit is Approaching

The Aggies will receive a forfeit next week, which will bring the Aggies win total to at least four. It will give the Aggies more wins than they have had in the last three years combined. The Aggies will not play Delaware State this season because the Hornets decided to forfeit the game tafter running into a scheduling conflict with the University of Michigan they could not relinquish because of financial concerns. The Aggies were to play the Hornets on Oct. 17 at Aggie Stadium, but instead the Aggies will be given a victory. This essentially means the Aggies will have two bye weeks in 2009.

Conference Honors

The conference released its weekly honors and named senior quarterback Carlton Fears MEAC Offensive Player of the Week. Fears threw for a career-high 166 yards and two touchdowns, including a game-winning 24-yard touchdown toss to Wallace Miles in double overtime. Fears also rushed for 58 yards on 13 carries. Alex Harper was named MEAC Offensive Lineman of the Week. Harper had nine pancake blocks and he helped the Aggies gain 173 yards on the ground.

Miles picks up yards in Aggies victory

Wallace Miles put together the Aggies first 100-yard receiving game of the season. He was the first Aggie to go over 100-yards receiving since Giorgio Lowrance had 115 yards against Norfolk State on Sept. 13, 2008, a span of 14 games. Blocked Success

North Carolina A&T's special teams play has been superb this season. The most improved area so far this season has been blocking field goal or extra point attempts. The Aggies have blocked four kicks this season, led by Jarrell Herring's two. The Aggies have blocked either an extra point or a field goal in each game except for the Coastal Carolina game. The Aggies blocked field goal by Quay Long against Winston-Salem State kept the Rams from taking the lead in the third quarter. Herring's blocked extra point against Norfolk State forced the Spartans to go for a touchdown instead of a field goal in the late minutes of a four-point ballgame. Last week, Herring's blocked field goal prevented the Eagles from defeating the Aggies for the fourth straight time.

The linebacker battle

Today's game against Morgan State will feature two of the best linebackers in the conference in MSU senior George Howard and Aggies junior Brandon Jackson. Howard is averaging an amazing 15 tackles per game, while Jackson has posted two double-figure tackling games and averages 8.0 tackles per contest. Howard is first in the conference in tackles, while Jackson is third.

Running Back by committee

The Aggies have been using every resource they have to run the football this season. Not only have running backs Tony Coles, Mike Mayhew and Dontavious Payne seen a lot of action this season, but quarterback Carlton Fears and receiver Larry Raper also see carries in the Aggies offense. The multiple runners have kept the Aggies backfield healthy this season, and it has resulted in the Aggies having the third best rushing attack in the MEAC this season. Mike Mayhew leads the way with 323 yards rushing, which ranks him fifth in the conference. Only S.C. State and Florida A&M have better rushing attacks.

A Year Ago Against the Bears

There were not many bright spots in last season's game against Morgan State other than the fact that the Bears defensive coordinator is now the Aggies head coach, and the fact that the offensive coordinator is now the Aggies offensive coordinator. Those two factors are a good thing considering the Bears dominated the Aggies offensively and defensively in a 41-3 win at Aggie Stadium. The Bears held the Aggies to just 139 yards of total offense while compiling 450 yards of offense. Devan James had 120 of those yards on 27 carries. He also scored a touchdown. Quarterback Carlton Jackson threw for 128 yards and a touchdown on 7-for-12 passing. Receiver Edwin Baptiste caught two passes for 30 yards. Linebackers George Howard and Troy Leftwich had five tackles apiece. Carlton Fears led the Aggies in rushing last season with 52 yards on five carries. Wallace Miles and Giorgio Lowrance caught one pass apiece last season, but they went for a combined minus-1 yard. Defensively, Jarrell Herring led the way for the Aggies with eight tackles.

An Aggies Win Means

...The Aggies would have traveled farther for this win than any other win they have had in the last four seasons. The Aggies only win away from Aggie Stadium came 25 miles down the road when the Aggies defeated the Rams earlier this season. The Aggies have not won a game outside the state of North Carolina in four years.

...The Aggies will win more than one conference game in a season for the first time since 2003. In '03, the Aggies won the MEAC by going 8-1 in the conference.

...The Aggies will essentially earn his fifth win of the season with forfeit upcoming. It would put the Aggies one win away from their first winning season in six years. In fact, in the last four seasons, the Aggies have won only six games.

NO TURNOVERS ARE KEY

North Carolina A&T has yet to lose a game when they are turnover free. On the flipside, the Aggies are 0-2 when they do turn the ball over. The Aggies have an impressive plus-6 turnover margin this season. The Aggies highest turnover margin in the last 10 seasons was a plus-13 margin in 2003. In each of the Aggies championship seasons except for 1986, they have had a plus-double digit turnover margin. In other words, when the Aggies don't turn the ball over, championships usually come their way.

IT'S A FAMILY AFFAIR

Quay Long is not the first person in his family to play for a historically black college or university. In fact, he is the third of four brothers to play college football for an HBCU. And he is the third brother to play in the secondary for an HBCU. Long's brother Vontrae played safety for Howard from 1999-02. Vontrae Long was the MEAC Rookie of the Year in 1999 and he was a three-time first-team All-MEAC selection as well as a three-time All-American. Long's brother Brandon Long played for Livingstone College 2004-07. If Long continues to play well, he can continue the "Long" tradition of playing well in an HBCU secondary.

FAMILIAR TERRITORY

Alonzo Lee is the fifth head coach the Aggies have had in the last eight years. But this time around Lee had some familiarity to his staff. Defensive back coach Travis Oliver has been with the Aggies through four of the five administrations. Oliver enters his sixth season at N.C. A&T, so the Aggies secondary has pretty much had stability over the past few seasons. Offensive coordinator/offensive line-men coach Chennis Berry spent three seasons at N.C. A&T (2003-2005). Berry is familiar with some of the recent Aggie graduates, so there was not a bid adjustment for him returning. Defensive line/special teams coordinator Tyrone Odums was the Aggies defensive coordinator last season. Running backs coach George Ragsdale has been on the staff the last four seasons. He even had a stint as the Aggies interim head coach in 2008. And of course, there is Lee, who was the Aggies defensive coordinator from 2003-05. He recruited defensive line-men Tyre Glasper and Adam Beal.

THE MAD TACKLER

Andre Thornton is slowly moving up the all-time tackles list for N.C. A&T. He has 248 career tackles, 19.5 tackles for loss and 10 pass deflections for his career. On Saturday, Thornton recorded three tackles. Thornton has averaged 73.7 tackles per season since being an Aggie. At that pace, he will come close to finishing with 300 career tackles, which would put him in the top 7 all-time. He needs just 13 tackles to move into the top 10 all-time on the list.

Overtime Rules

The NCAA tiebreaker system established in 1996 will be used when a game is tied after four periods. NCAA football-playing rules apply. The officials will escort the captains (Rule 3-1-1) to the center of the field for the coin toss. The referee shall toss a coin at mid-field in the presence of no more than four captains from each team and another game official, first designating the field captain of the visiting team to call the coin toss. The winner of the toss shall choose one of the following options:

1. Offense or defense, with the offense at the opponent's 25-yard line to start the first series.
 2. Which end of the field shall be used for both series of that overtime period.
- Note: The winner of the toss may not defer his choice.

The loser of the toss shall exercise the remaining option for the first extra period and shall have the first choice of the two options for subsequent even-numbered extra periods. An extra period shall consist of two series with each team putting the ball in play by a snap at the designated 25-yard line. Each team retains the ball during a series until it scores or fails to make a first down. The team scoring the greater number of points during the regulation and extra periods shall be declared the winner. There shall be an equal number of series in each extra period, except if one team scores during a period other than on the try. Beginning with the third extra period, teams scoring a touchdown must attempt a two-point try.

The Roster Breakdown

The Aggies are hoping for success this season, but they definitely built for the future. The Aggies roster consists of 31 true freshmen and six redshirt freshmen. There are also 21 sophomores on the roster to go along with 16 juniors and 14 seniors. The N.C. A&T football team is represented by 14 states and Washington, D.C. By far North Carolina is represented the most with 51 players from the Old North State. The state of Florida is represented well with eight players on the roster. The Aggies roster also has six players from Georgia and three players apiece are from California, Michigan and Maryland. The other states represented include Louisiana, New York, South Carolina, Kentucky, Alabama, New Jersey and Tennessee.

Expanding the depth chart

North Carolina A&T head coach Alonzo Lee has consistently preached that no position has a name on it. In other words, each week players will have to compete for their positions. This apparently includes kickers. Freshman Patrick Courtney took over the kicking duties days before the start of the season because two-year kicker Eric Houston was not eligible to play. Courtney has struggled at times this season, and missed two field goals against N.C. Central. Aggies coach Alonzo Lee announced that receiver Wallace Miles will compete with Courtney for the kicker's position.

Lee's Tour Continues

Coach Alonzo Lee's tour through the schools he once coached at continues today when the Aggies face Morgan State. Lee served as the Bears defensive coordinator the previous three seasons. His first meeting against a former employer came against Hampton on Sept. 19. It didn't go well as the Pirates defeated the Aggies 24-14. Lee won two MEAC Championships as the defensive coordinator of the Pirates from 1997-2002. Lee has three more shots at victories at his former schools, including today's game. The Aggies also play Howard and Florida A&M.

Cracking the Top 10

The Aggies moved ever so closer to earning their first ranking in the SBN Poll in four seasons. The Aggies garnered 28 votes this week, 16 behind No. Morgan State in the poll this week. A win over the Bears this weekend could enter the Aggies into the poll. The Aggies last appearance came in 2004 when the Aggies were coming off of their 2003 MEAC Championship season. The SBN poll has traditionally determined the mythical Black College National Champion.

Homecoming invitees

The Aggies will play in back-to-back homecomings starting Saturday at Morgan State. After facing the Bears on their homecoming, the Aggies travel to D.C., to face Howard for its homecoming on Oct. 24.

- He also coached at Florida State and Arizona. Lee also played under John Teerlinck (current Indianapolis Colts defensive line coach) at Eastern Illinois. He also coached under legendary college football coaches Willie Jeffries, Billy Joe and Joe Taylor.
- During his 12 seasons as a defensive coordinator, Lee coached 13 All-Americans. Those players were either AFCA, Associated Press or SBN Black College All-Americans.

Senior quarterback Carlton Fears threw for 131 yards on 17-for-31 passing, and he added 78 yards rushing and a touchdown to lead the Aggies to a 19-10 win over the Rams at Bowman Gray Stadium.

It was the first career win for Aggies head coach Alonzo Lee. He becomes just the fifth Aggies head coach to win his debut.

The Aggies offense compiled 285 yards of offense, which is a moral victory for an offense that struggled mightily last season.

A bad snap over the head of Rams punter Landen Thayer, gave the Aggies the ball at the Rams 10 with 9:23 remaining in the game. Three plays later, with two missed field goals already on Patrick Courtney's stat sheet, Lee turned to his young kicker. Courtney responded by booming a 25-yard field through the upright for a 13-10 Aggies lead.

Another young player – defensive lineman Brandon Young – came up with the play that put the Aggies in position to clinch the victory. The Aggies flushed Rams quarterback Branden Williams out of the pocket.

In his haste to get away from Aggie defenders, Williams dropped the football and had it recovered by Young at the Rams 18. Fears collected 17 yards on the drive, and sophomore running back Mike Mayhew finished off the drive with a 1-yard touchdown with 1:55 to go.

The Aggies defense held the Rams to just 90 yards of offense and forced two turnovers.

 North Carolina A&T didn't allow a point over the final 44 minutes of the game to earn a 17-13 win at Aggie Stadium. The win gives the Aggies their first 1-0 start in the MEAC in four years. Their last 1-0 start came at the expense of NSU.

The Aggies overcame a slow start and a 13-3 deficit to take a 17-13 lead to open the second half. Sophomore running back Mike Mayhew carried the ball on all five plays of the Aggies 61-yard scoring drive that was aided by a five-yard Norfolk State penalty.

Although Mayhew's score ended up being the game-winning touchdown, the Spartans were not above seriously threatening to take the lead in the fourth quarter.

A 29-yard run by DeAngelo Branch and a 9-yard run by quarterback Dennis Brown gave the Spartans the ball at the Aggie 6 with just over 11 minutes to play. Three plays later, the Spartans faced a 4th-and-goal from the 1. Brown tried to take the lead with a quarterback sneak, but the Aggies defense led by middle linebacker Brandon Jackson stopped Brown's progress before he could cross the goal line.

Lee said he wanted to pinch his interior defensive lineman, while having two guys coming off the edge to guard against NSU using the agile Brown on a quarterback rollout.

The Spartans had one last drive to mount. NSU gave the Aggies cause for concern when Brown completed 10-yard out to Chris Bell on a 4th-and-8 from the Aggies 42. But the Aggies defense stiffened from there, allowing the Spartans just one yard over the next four plays. With no timeouts remaining for the Spartans, the game essentially ended when Aggies defensive end Tyre Glasper forced Brown to rush his throw to Jeremy Wicker for an incomplete pass.

GREENSBORO – The North Carolina A&T football team’s 2-0 start had a lot to do with the Aggies not turning the ball over, running the ball effectively and not surrendering big plays.

Those three components were missing Saturday night as

Hampton defeated the Aggies 24-14 on an ESPNU telecast from Aggie Stadium. The Aggies dropped to 0-6 on ESPN telecast. Senior Jarrell Herring led the Aggies with 12 tackles.

None of the 129 plays the Aggies (2-1, 1-1 MEAC) ran over the first two games were complemented with a turnover. The Aggies reversed that trend on Saturday with three turnovers. The third turnover was an interception thrown by freshman quarterback Lewis Kindle that led to a Brandon Roundtree 5-yard interception return for a touchdown.

Roundtree’s return gave the Pirates a 24-7 lead with 12:27 remaining in the game. Kindle spelled senior starter Carlton Fears in the fourth quarter after Fears threw for 110 yards, a touchdown and an interception on 8-for-16 passing. The drive in which Kindle threw the interception was his first time seeing action this season.

Lee said the two had competed in practice all week for the starting job against the Pirates. The two will do the same in the days leading up to the game against Coastal Carolina on Sept. 26. Lee warned that people shouldn’t focus on an Aggies quarterback controversy. All of the Aggie starting positions are up for grabs each week, according to Lee.

The Aggies had success moving the ball early. Their first drive ended at the Hampton 27-yard line on a fumble, while their second possession stopped at the Hampton 24 on a turnover on downs. The Aggies had another excellent scoring opportunity to start the second half.

Hampton (2-1, 1-0) turned the ball over on its first possession of the third quarter as Tyre Glasper and Jamison Hedgepeth stripped the football from Hampton quarterback Herbert Bynes. Jamal Wardlaw recovered at the Pirates 31. But on the first play of the Aggies drive, Roundtree stepped in front of Fears’ pass to secure the first of his two interceptions on the day. The Aggies offense did slow down in the second half. Before N.C. A&T sophomore running Mike Mayhew closed out the scoring in the game with a 59-yard touchdown run with 3:41 remaining; the Aggies had just minus-13 yards rushing in the second half.

Whether it is five plays or one, the North Carolina A&T football team is going to find the group of plays or play it can run effectively.

Despite making some big plays on Saturday, the N.C. A&T offense never found the consistency it was looking for

in a 28-7 loss to Coastal Carolina at Brooks Stadium.

Sophomore running back Mike Mayhew led the Aggies with 84 yards rushing on 11 carries. But through the air, senior Aggie quarterback Carlton Fears threw for 99 yards on 7-for-22 passing and two interceptions. Freshman quarterback Lewis Kindle threw four passes. He completed one and had an interception.

Coastal Carolina had something to do with the Aggies woes. The Chanticleers sacked Fears four times. On the offensive end, Coastal rushed for 304 yards led by Eric O'Neal's 130 yards on 23 carries. Tommy Fraser chipped in with 98 yards and a touchdown on 16 carries. The Aggies defense did intercept two passes.

The first pick halted a threatening drive by Coastal in the first quarter as Quay Long intercepted a Zach MacDowall pass in the end zone. The second led to the Aggies only score of the game as MacDowall threw a pass out in the flats only to find senior linebacker Andre Thornton standing there for the interception at the Aggies 35-yard line.

The Aggies took over at their own 40 and quickly went deep to freshman receiver Larry Raper for a 51-yard gain to the Chanticleer 9. Raper wasn't done. On the next play, he took the hand-off on an end-around and scored a 9-yard touchdown to cut the Chanticleers lead to 14-7 midway through the third quarter. The Aggies defense kept the momentum going by holding the Chanticleers to a three-and-out series to give the offense the ball back.

Fears' 27-yard run on the Aggies ensuing drive advanced the ball to the Chanticleer 49 with 1:14 remaining in the third quarter. It was the last real offensive threat the Aggies made in the game. The next three plays after Fears' run went for no yardage, forcing an Aggies punt.

The Chanticleers took advantage. On a 3rd-and-3 from their own 45, MacDowall found Brandon Whitley for a short pass that Whitley turned into a 55-yard touchdown reception for a 21-7 Chanticleers lead. Coastal closed out the Aggies with a 39-yard touchdown run by Fraser.

Carlton Fears connected with sophomore receiver Wallace Miles for a 24-yard touchdown pass to give the Aggies a 23-17 double overtime win over the Eagles.

Fears threw for a career-high 166 yards and two touchdowns. The Eagles were led by senior receiver Will Scott who also had a career day with five catches for 179 yards and a touchdown.

The hotly contested game marked the fifth time in the last six matchups the Aggie-Eagle game was decided by a touchdown or less. It was also the third time in the last 12 contests the game ended in overtime.

As Miles leaped over the end zone, it secured the Aggies third straight overtime win. Their last extra period win came on Oct. 8, 2005 at FedEx Field against Morgan State. There was tons of drama before Miles' game-winning score. But the actual craziness started when NCCU quarterback Michael Johnson connected with Scott for a 20-yard gain to the Aggies 10-yard line with the Eagles trailing the Aggies 17-14 with 5:02 remaining in regulation.

Three weeks ago, the Aggies had a thrilling goal line stand against Norfolk State. They found themselves in the same stingy mood on Saturday. On 3rd-and-goal from the 18-foot line, Aggies safety Vernon White sliced through NCCU blockers to stop Tim Shankle for a 2-yard loss. Freshman kicker Frankie Cardelle tied the game with a 20-yard field goal with 2:36 remaining. It appeared the Eagles would get a chance to win the game in the closing minutes as the Aggies faced a 3rd-and-18 from their own 38 with a little more than a minute remaining. But senior receiver Giorgio Lowrance was able to go up high and bring down a 33-yard reception that kept the Aggies hopes of a last-second victory alive. Three plays later, a 5-yard Mike Mayhew run put the ball on the NCCU 20 with 11 seconds remaining. But freshman Patrick Courtney's 37-yard field goal came up short, sending the game into overtime.

In collegiate overtimes, the ball is placed at the opponent's 25, and each team is guaranteed at least one possession. The first possession of overtime went to the Aggies. An unsportsmanlike penalty on a 3rd-and-8 gave the Aggies a first down at the Eagles 14. But the Aggies gained only two yards in three plays, setting up a 29-yard field goal from Courtney. His kick went wide left, leaving the Eagles with a chance to win the game. On their first possession of overtime, a face mask penalty helped the Eagles move the ball to the Aggies 10 before brining on Cardelle who narrowly missed a 49-yard field goal earlier in the game. This kick would be much shorter – 27 yards – and it was for the game. The Aggies had an answer for Cardelle's foot. They didn't let the ball get anywhere near the upright.

Senior Jarrell Herring came charging through to block Cardelle's kick, forcing overtime. Herring's blocked kick marked the fourth time in five games the Aggies have either blocked a field goal or extra point.

The Eagles took first possession in the second overtime. An unsportsmanlike penalty on the Eagles was called after the blocked field goal. Therefore, NCCU had to start its drive on the Aggies 40. The Eagles moved the ball to the 35 and sent Cardelle back out to attempt a 52-yard field goal. Cardelle's kick went through the upright, but it didn't count because his team called timeout before he kicked it.

Rison had a change of heart after the inopportune timeout. The Eagles went for it on 4th-and-5, but this time Johnson's pass sailed past Scott to end the Eagles possession. Two plays later, Miles was in the end zone.
