Phillip McAlpin

Director of Development for Athletics

Phillip McAlpin became the Director of Development for Athletics at NC A&T State University on November 9, 2004. He oversees and manages NC A&T's marketing, media, special events and

sponsorship efforts.

McAlpin serves as the executive director of the university's Victory Club, a membership organization that raises money for NC A&T Athletics. Prior to coming to NC A&T, McAlpin was assistant area development director for the United Negro College Fund.

He is responsible for the solicitation of corporate, foundation, organization and individual supporters of UNCF programs for the benefit of its 39 historically black colleges and university membership.

He has also served in several other executive capacities including owner of the Focal Point Marketing and Consulting Firm, president of the Historically Black Collegiate Coalition, president and CEO of FOCUS Marketing Inc., and marketing consultant/owner of McAlpin and Associates.

McAlpin received a B.S. degree in business administration from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He is a member of numerous organizations including the Association of Fundraising Professionals, Greater Baltimore Committee and Washington, D.C. Board of Trade.



Billy Edrington

Associate Athletics Director for Facilities/Gameday Operations

Billy Edrington has been associated with NC A&T more than 20 years. He was promoted to associate athletics director for facilities in July 2002. He

is responsible for all matters of facilities pertaining to Aggie Athletics as well as being in charge of game day operations.

Mr. Edrington graduated from NC A&T in 1987 with a bachelor's degree in secondary education. From 1986-97 Edrington was an assistant coach on the NC A&T women's basketball team. He was an integral part in the Lady Aggies success during the 1993-94 season when they won the MEAC tournament championship and became the first team in Lady Aggie history to compete in the NCAA Tournament. While a student, Edrington's involvement with NC A&T also included working with sports medicine under the tutelage of famed trainer Thomas Bynum.

The Rocky Mount native interests include meeting people and listening to jazz. He is married to the former Lynn Dark and they have a son, Myles and a daughter, Kennedy.



Wheeler Brown

Associate Athletics Director/Internal Operations

Wheeler "Big Wheel" Brown enters his fifth year as the Associate Athletics Director for Internal Operations at North Carolina A&T State University. He is a 1979 graduate of N.C. A&T and a

former All-MEAC performer on the offensive line. In 2003, he earned the prestigious honor of being named to N.C. A&T's Sports Hall of Fame. A four-year starter from 1974-78, Brown played on the Aggies first MEAC Championship team in 1975.

Before returning to his alma mater in 2002, Brown served as the associate athletics director and assistant men's basketball coach at Bowie State for a year. He began his professional career as a teacher and coach at C.L. Haper High School in Atlanta. After a five-year stay there, he became the head men's basketball coach at Howard Community College in Columbia, Md., where he coached for 10 seasons. In 1996, he earned his first top-level position in athletic administration when he accepted a position as Wheeling Jesuit University's assistant athletics director and head men's basketball coach. Brown has more than 20 years experience as a teacher, coach and administrator.

He has coached teams to numerous championships and compiled a 191-110 record as a collegiate head coach.

Angela Peterson serves as North Carolina A&T's Director of Auxiliary services. She also plays a major role in North Carolina A&T Athletics when it comes to the departments finances.

Assistant Athletics Director for
Student Services

Shelley Davis is in her first year as the Assistant Athletics Director for Student Services. Davis is responsible for making sure students adhere to the academic standards of North Carolina A&T and the NCAA. She also acts as a liaison between student-athletes and the

University's faculty, staff and administration. Before taking over her current position, Davis was an assistant athletics trainer at N.C. A&T. Her primary responsibilities were providing practice and competition coverage for men's and women's basketball, baseball and the track and field teams.

She came to N.C. A&T from Virginia Union. There, she provided coverage for all 15 sports programs at the private Division II school, and designed Sports Medicine Policies and Procedures manual defining emergency protocol, catastrophic injury procedure and infectious disease control. She kept the Virginia Union men's basketball team healthy enough to win the CIAA Tournament and the Division II National Championship.

In addition to her many duties as an athletic trainer, she also coached the track and field teams at Virginia Union. Davis earned the honor to be named the head athletic trainer for the CIAA Men's Basketball Tournament. She was also the head trainer for the 2004 Richmond Pro Am Basketball League, which featured present and former NBA players, such as Ben Wallace.

Davis is a 1998 graduate of North Carolina Central. She has started coursework toward a Master's of Health Science with a Sports Medicine concentration.



LaWanda Wallace

Coordinator of Academic Monitoring for Athletics

LaWanda Wallace accepted the position of coordinator of Academic Monitoring for Athletics in September of 2005. Wallace monitors the academic progress of more than 350 student-athletes at NC A&T.

She collaborates with the Associate Athletic Director for Compliance to ensure that student-athletes are adhering to NCAA regulations concerning eligibility. Wallace, is a 2001 graduate of North Carolina A&T State University. She received her undergraduate degree in marketing and her master's degree in adult education in 2004 from NC A&T.

Head Athletic Trainer

Robert Woodall was hired as North Carolina A&T State University's head athletic trainer in August of 2005. Woodall will be responsible for overseeing the wellness of more than 350 student-athletes. He will work with athletes on the prevention,

rehabilitation and evaluation of injuries with his two assistants and student trainers.

Woodall brings to N.C. A&T a wealth of collegiate experience as a trainer. Woodall, a 2000 graduate of Florida State in the field of nutrition and fitness, served his most recent stint as an athletics trainer with Averett University in Danville, Va. Woodall oversaw the care of Averett's volleyball, men's basketball and baseball athletes. In addition, he served as an approved clinical instructor within the accredited athletic training program of the university.

Before arriving at Averett in August of 2004, Woodall spent 3 years at neighboring Guilford College as the assistant athletic trainer and rehabilitation coordinator. There his duties included caring for the Quakers football, women's basketball and men's lacrosse programs.

Woodall worked directly with team physicians in pre-participation screenings, in-season evaluations and athlete referrals for office examinations.

In May of 2000, Woodall earned his Master's of Science degree in kinesiology from Louisiana University. The department of recreational sports at LSU benefited from Woodall's services while he was a graduate student. He served as the department's head athletic trainer for nearly two years. During the same time period, he was the head athletics trainer for University High School in Baton Rouge, La.

Woodall is a member of the National Athletic Trainers Association; the Mid-Atlantic Athletic Trainers Association and the North Carolina Board of Athletic Trainers.

ACADEMIC ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM

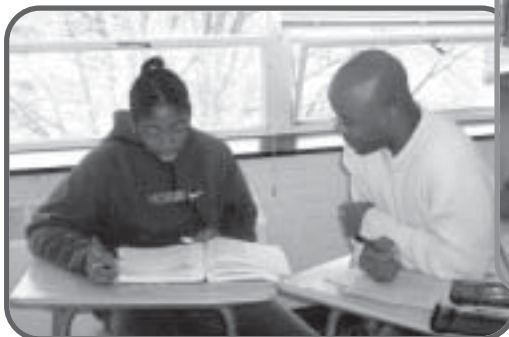
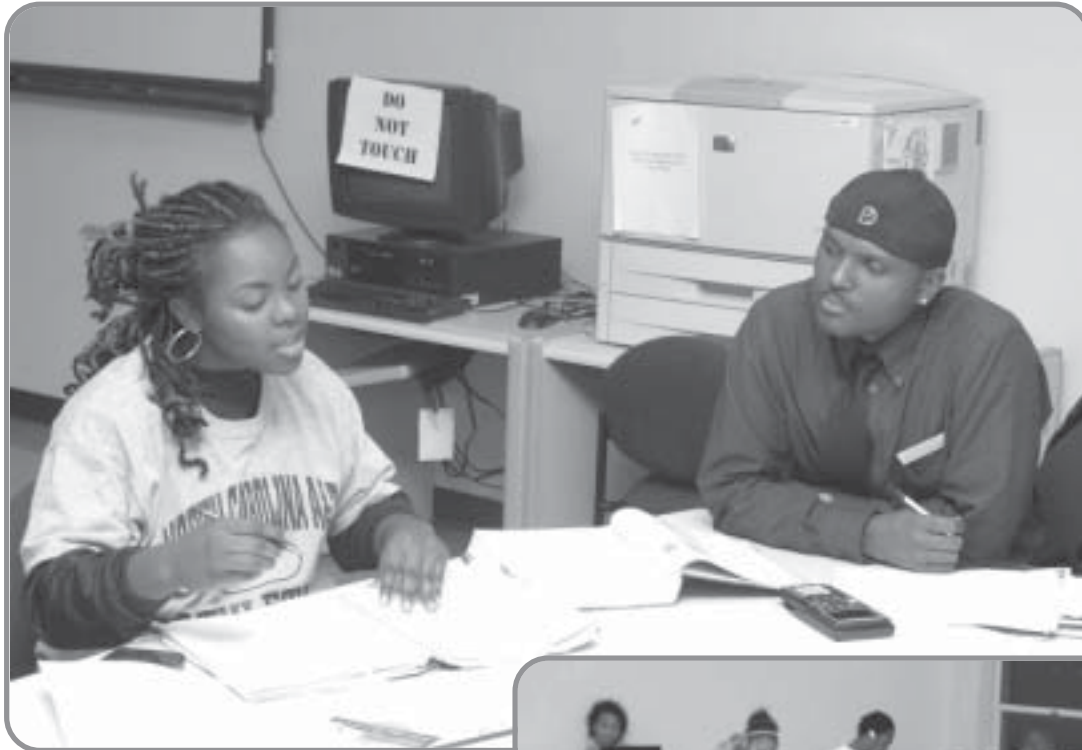

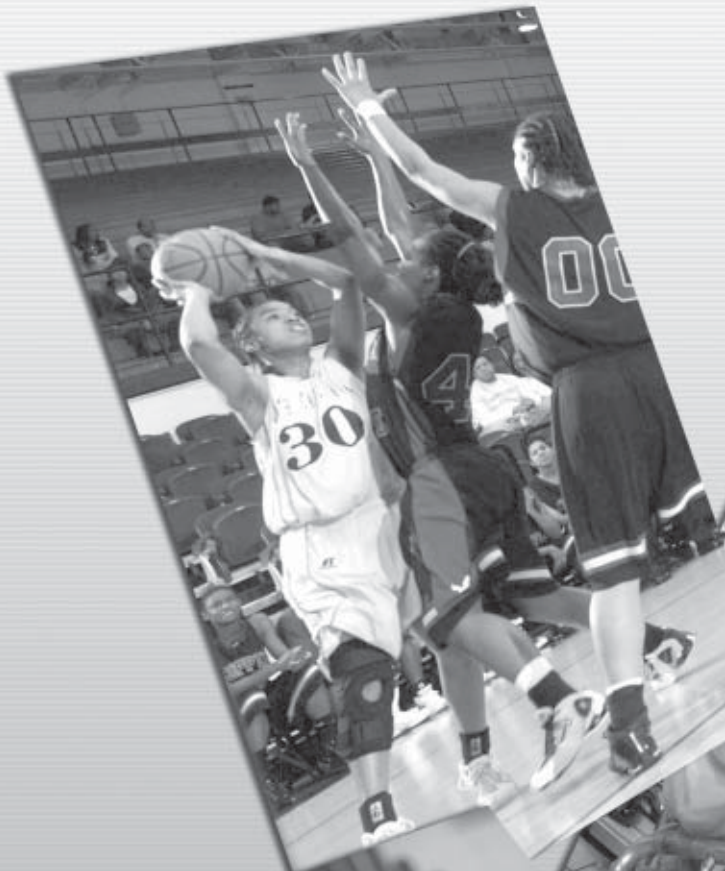

The program achieves some of its goals through tutorials, providing weekly tutoring in difficult subjects, study halls providing a more suitable environment for studying and the laptop loan program allowing athletes to complete assignments while traveling.

Lastly, the Helping Athletes Rise to the Top (H.A.R.T.) program creates a peer-supported environment for student athletes to maximize academic, personal and social growth.
