AGGIES OVERVIEW: The North Carolina A&T State baseball team (17-15, 7-4) will begin a five-game road swing away from War Memorial Stadium starting this weekend traveling to N.C. Central (20-16, 6-6) for a Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) weekend series beginning on Saturday with a doubleheader at 1 p.m. The Aggies have won eight of their last nine games including five straight against MEAC opponents.

WEEK IN REVIEW: N.C. A&T is coming off a 9-2 win over Appalachian State at home on Wednesday. Zach McLean had his third multiple-hit game of the season going 3-for-4 at the plate while scoring a career-high three runs. LHP Jonah Owenby improved to a 3-0 record on the mound tossing 3.1 innings striking out two and walking two batters. Over the weekend, the Aggies won a MEAC home series against Florida A&M moving into first place in the conference southern division with a 7-4 record. Marcello Betances earned his first win of the season in the second game as the Aggies completed a sweep taking a doubleheader (3-2, 13-4) on Friday against the Rattlers. The Aggies posted season-highs in runs (13), RBI (12), home runs (3), triples (2) and total bases (30) smashing four home runs in the first inning against FAMU.

RIVERA NAMED MEAC CO-PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Milton Rivera was named MEAC co-player of the week for his performance during the week of April 2-8, helping the Aggies to a 3-1 record. He went a combined 8-for-17 (.417) for the week, hit two home runs, drove in four runs and scored five more runs. He homered and scored twice in helping the Aggies beat FAMU twice. Rivera went 3-for-5 with three RBIs and a homer against Presbyterian before adding a 3-for-4 effort in the second game of the doubleheader against FAMU. Rivera also stole two bases during the week.

N.C. CENTRAL OVERVIEW: The Eagles enter the weekend on a five-game skid falling to Campbell (3-1) on Tuesday and Norfolk State (12-3) on Wednesday in non-conference action. With a 6-6 MEAC record, NCCU sits fourth in the division and leads the MEAC in base on balls, doubles, home runs, runs, scoring, slugging percentage and win-loss percentage. Carter Williams leads the conference in triples and total bases while Zach Michalski is both the home run leader and RBI leader. Corey Joyce is the conference leader in doubles, slugging percentage, total bases and stolen bases. Jacob Raby is tops in base on balls. Chris Kernen has the lowest ERA and Devin Sweet is first in strikeouts and strikeout-to-walk ratio amongst the MEAC.

LOOKING AHEAD: The Aggies will wrap-up their road swing with back-to-back games at USC Upstate on Tuesday, Apr. 17 at 6 p.m. followed by Elon on Wednesday, Apr. 18 at 6 p.m.

- Halfway through the college baseball season the Aggies are ranked top-100 nationally in a number of categories: triples (51st/9), hits allowed per nine innings (52nd/7.97), stolen bases (53rd/44), double plays (65th/27), WHIP (73rd/1.35), earned run average (82nd/3.92).

- N.C. A&T is ranked in the top-3 in the conference as a team and top-10 individually in a number of categories: As a team, the Aggies lead the MEAC in earned run average, hits allowed per nine innings, triples and in WHIP while ranking in the top-3 in double plays, doubles, doubles per game, fielding percentage, hits by pitch, home runs, home runs per game, runs, slugging percentage, triples per game, win-loss percentage and walks allowed per nine innings.
- Individually, Marcello Betances and Michael Johnson are first and second in hits allowed per nine innings while Betances and Tim Luth are tied for third in games started. Johnson is first in earned run average and is second in both victories and WHIP. Josh Bottenfield is the conference leader and ranks third in the nation in pitching appearances. Adan Ordonez is first in the MEAC and fourth in the nation in toughest to strike out. Milton Rivera and Perry Hunt are in the top-5 in triples with Greg White ranking in the top-10 in both doubles and hit by pitch.
- Myles Sowell is on a current eight game hit streak and Forest Kimbrell in on a four-game streak. Milton Rivera, Greg White and AJ Hunt have all recorded 11 multi-hit games this season. Dawnoven Smith is the only Aggie with four RBI in a game this year and leads the squad with five multiple RBI games.

STIKELEATHER NAMED MEAC CO-PITCHER OF THE WEEK

Senior Josh Stikeleather was named MEAC Co-Pitcher of the Week on Monday, Mar. 19. He led the Aggies on the mound, allowing no runs or hits in seven innings while striking out seven in two appearances. He picked up the save, his second of the season, against Presbyterian, tossing a hitless ninth inning. He followed that up with 3.2 scoreless innings of relief on Friday against St. Bonaventure, an outing in which he struck out seven and didn't allow a hit before picking up the win.

PRESEASON RANKINGS

The Aggies were tabbed to finish second in the Preseason MEAC Southern Division coaches poll. N.C. A&T finished behind favorite Bethune-Cookman who received 13 first place votes. The Aggies (64) followed the Wildcats just edging out third place Florida A&M (63) that received five first-place votes. North Carolina Central (37) was picked fourth and Savannah State (22) was fifth. Delaware State (67) landed 13 first-place votes to lead the northern division predictions. The Hornets finished second in the division last season and advanced to the third day of the 2017 MEAC Baseball Championship. Norfolk State (56) received five first-place votes and was picked second, then Coppin State (32) and Maryland Eastern Shore (25) was fourth in the north.

FIVE AGGIES SELECTED TO 2018 ALL-MEAC PRESEASON TEAM

Three Aggies were selected the 2018 MEAC Baseball Preseason All-Conference First Team and two made the Second Team. Catcher Ardan Ordonez (5-7, 180, SR, Clermont, Fla.), shortstop Brandon Melendez (5-9, 180, SR, Fort Lauderdale, Fla.) and outfielder Myles Sowell (6-2, 180, SR, Greensboro, N.C.) were the first team selections. Outfielder Greg White (6-1, 180, SR, Greensboro, N.C.) and at utility Perry "AJ" Hunt (5-11, 180, SR, Chesapeake, Va.) made the second team.

FOURTH YEAR

Fourth year head coach of the N.C. A&T Aggies baseball team Ben Hall was named the 2017 MEAC Coach of the Year and returns 25 letterwinners that went 28-25 and 15-9 in the conference, tying a school record for conference wins a 15-game improvement from 2016.

2017 AT A GLANCE

The 2017 Aggies baseball team tied a school record for conference wins going 15-9 while improving their overall season wins by 15 games. Coach Hall contributes last year's success to big time recruiting and the experience of the returning players. A&T ranked second in the MEAC in both double plays (42) and double play per game (0.79) while sitting fifth in ERA (5.29) and sixth in fielding percentage (0.946). A major factor to the Aggies 2017 success was a first-team All-MEAC honoree and was on the Midseason Watch List for the 13th annual National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association Stopper of the Year Award, pitcher Cutter Dyals. Dyals became the 19th player in program history to be selected in the MLB draft. In his one season with the Aggies, Dyals finished with an impressive 0.50 ERA holding batters to .190.

2018 AGGIE SCHEDULE

The 2018 schedule features 32 home contests and 20 games on the road, including 28 nonconference matchups to go along with the 24 MEAC games. The schedule includes three opponents from the Big South, two opponents from the ACC, Patriot League and Atlantic-10 conferences and teams from the SEC, Southern Conference, SWAC, Sun Belt and Atlantic Sun.

OUTLOOK ON AGGIE CATCHERS

All three catchers for the Aggies are polarizing guys. Ordonez has played in 148 career games for the Aggies and made his second All-MEAC Baseball First Team honors in 2017. He has been on the field for the Aggies and has the history and performance to lead a team both physically in the clutch and away from the field. Jarrett Norman and Rhyne Stanley will see time behind the plate. Norman has played a lot in his two seasons and has emerged as one of the vocal leaders of the Aggies.

OUTLOOK ON AGGIE OUTFIELDERS

Looking to lead the outfielders will be a pair of All-MEAC Preseason Team members in left fielder Greg White and center fielder Myles Sowell. White was the Aggie leader in hits (73), doubles (12), stolen bases (15), total plate appearances (214) and at bats (181). Sowell was ranked second in the conference in triples (5), fifth in both runs scored (41) and batting average (.356) while finishing eighth in both total bases (87) and hits (62). Right fielders Camden Williamson and Dawnovan Smith will also add depth to the returning outfielders.

OUTLOOK ON AGGIE INFIELDBERS

Short stop Brandon Melendez, third baseman AJ Hunt and second baseman Milton Rivera started last season for the Aggies and with their return have raised expectations for the Aggies infielders. Melendez led the Aggies in batting average (.363), on base percentage (.442) and in walks (21). Hunt was amongst the MEAC leaders last season ranking tied for fourth in home runs (6) and ninth in slugging percentage (.483).

OUTLOOK ON AGGIE PITCHERS

Marcello Betances led the Aggies in strikeouts (58), innings pitched (71.2) and games started (14) posting a 5.40 ERA. Michael Johnson struck out 36 and ranked fifth in the conference in walks allowed (18). He made 12 starts with a 6.16 ERA in 64.1 innings pitched

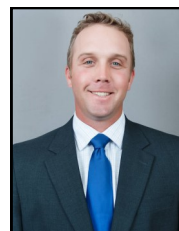

Ben Hall was named the interim head coach at North Carolina A&T on Oct. 23, 2014. After a full season in that role, N.C. A&T Athletics Director Earl M. Hilton III named Hall the permanent coach on July 21, 2015, making Hall the ninth Aggies baseball coach since the Aggies became an NCAA program in 1982.

In his first season as the Aggies headman, the experienced hitting instructor, helped catcher Adan Odonez earn MEAC Rookie of the Year and first-team All-MEAC honors. His move to make Brandon Wilkerson the Aggies leadoff hitter helped Wilkerson, a senior, earn his first all-conference accolade. Timothy Ravare also earned All-MEAC honors as a utility player. In Hall's second year, shortstop Milton Rivera had a career year by hitting .349 with seven home runs to earn first-team all-conference honors.

The previous year before Hall arrived the Aggies were hitting .245 as a team. They hit .264 as a team in his first year in 2015 and during the 2016 season the team hit .274. Among the hitters who have improved under Hall from 2015 to 2016 are Kyle Clary (.221-.300), Timothy Ravare (.286-.306) and Rivera (.299-.349). Rivera earned his first-ever first-team All-MEAC selection thanks to his offensive improvement.

Hall came to N.C. A&T after spending three seasons with the Winthrop Eagles baseball program. During his time with the Eagles he assisted with infielders, hitters and all aspects of recruiting, which included 2014 first-team All-Big South outfielder TJ Olesczuk who was drafted by the Baltimore Orioles and 2013 all-conference third baseman Chad Smith.

Before accepting the post at Winthrop, Hall worked at Division II Wingate for four seasons. He started there as a graduate assistant before being promoted to an assistant coach in 2010, where he worked with hitters and infielders. In 2011, the Bulldogs finished in the top-10 in hits, doubles, home runs and slugging percentage nationally.

The Bulldogs finished 34-22, won the South Atlantic Conference Tournament and earned a bid to the Southeast Regional in 2011. Slugger Dodson McPherson was one of the best offensive players in the country, earning SAC Player of the Year. He was also named first-team All-SAC, first-team All-Southeast Region, Southeast Region Player of the Year, first-team All-American (by two different publications) and was a finalist for the Tino Martinez Award which goes to the Division II player of the year.

Hall's other slugger at Wingate, Brian Yeung, led the nation in doubles and was among the nation's leaders in home runs, total bases and hits. Yeung scored second-and-third-team All-American accolades and was first-team All-Southeast Region.

Wingate won the SAC regular-season title in 2010 behind the bats of All-SAC performers Logan Issacs (second baseman) and Chris Vasquez (shortstop). After lettering twice at Clemson University in baseball, Hall began his coaching career as a student assistant coach at Clemson. As a player, he became familiar with A&T when the two schools faced each other in the 2005 NCAA regional in Clemson.

Hall played one season each at Stetson and Daytona Beach Community College before transferring to the Tigers. With Stetson he hit .321 and was named to the Atlantic Sun Conference All-Freshman team.

He received his undergraduate degree in sports management from Clemson in 2007 and his master of business administration degree from Wingate in 2009.
